

## Appointment of Scrutineer by Candidate

Form EL12A

- 
- A scrutineer arriving at a voting location must show this form and personal identification to the Poll Manager and take an Oral Oath of Secrecy.
  - A candidate who enters a voting location must show personal identification to the Poll Manager, take an Oral Oath of Secrecy, and is considered to be a scrutineer.
  - At any voting location, there is a limit of one scrutineer per candidate per vote tabulator.

### Rights and Prohibitions

Candidates and scrutineers **can**:

- Be present when materials and documents related to the election are delivered to the Clerk.
- Further to the Procedures for the Use of Vote Tabulators, inspect the ballot boxes, ballots and all other papers, forms and documents relating to the vote (but not so as to delay the timely opening of the voting location) 15 minutes before the voting location opens.
- Place their own seal on the ballot box, immediately before the opening of the voting place, so that ballots can be deposited in the box and cannot be withdrawn without breaking the seal.
  - Where a candidate is using their own seal, it shall be shown to the Poll Manager for approval before being placed on the ballot box. The seal must be a self-adhesive tape type and may not identify or promote the candidate.
- Object to a ballot being issued.
- Observe the vote tabulator process.
- Sign EL31 – Final Statement of Results prepared by the Poll Manager.
- Place their own seal on the ballot box immediately after the close of voting on all voting days so that ballots cannot be deposited or withdrawn without breaking the seal.

## Appointment of Scrutineer by Candidate – Form EL12A

- Examine the Voters' List periodically with the assistance of the Poll Manager during the course of the day but may not slow down or impede the voting process.

Candidates and scrutineers **cannot**:

- Campaign at the voting place.
- Display a candidate's election material (including buttons, pins, etc.) in a voting place.
- Park a vehicle displaying campaign material in the parking lot of the voting location.
- Compromise the secrecy of voting.
- Attempt, directly or indirectly, to interfere with how an elector votes.
- Communicate, obtain or attempt to obtain, any information about how an elector intends to vote or has voted.
- Interfere with the Election Officials in the discharge of their duties.
